AVIATION ARCHEOLOGY



The Colorado Aviation Historical Society is presently accepting applications for its May 2009Aviation Archaeology (AvAr) training course.

Consisting of classroom lecture and a field training exercise, this three-day course is spread over two weekends. Upon successful completion of all classroom subjects each student will receive a handsome, frameable graduation certificate. Those who go on to complete the [optional] field exercise will be awarded official Colorado Aviation Historical Society AvAr Field Agent credentials.

Classes will be held in the Main
Terminal Building of the Rocky Mountain Metropolitan Airport in Broomfield. Beginning promptly at 8:00 am on Saturday and Sunday (May 30 and 31), students can expect lecture sessions to end no later than 5:00 pm each day. Those applicants wishing to complete the field exercise required for full AvAr Field Agent accreditation, scheduled for Saturday, May 30th, will be briefed progressively during the classroom portion of the course.

Presented by recognized subject matter experts approved by NAIAA (the North American Institute of Aviation Archaeology), classroom instruction includes: an introduction to the Colorado

Aviation Historical Society and its mission; elementary map reading, pioneering skills and practical survival techniques; public laws and the Historic Preservation Act; principles of site investigation and documentation; simple aircraft component identification; historic aviation research methodology; basic imagery analysis; numerous actual case studies.

In addition, a representative from TIGHAR (The International Group for Historic Aircraft Recovery) will present an overview of current global operations as well as an update on that organization's search for Amelia Earhart.

At less than one hundred dollars per person, this is the most complete, cost effective training program offered anywhere that results in official accreditation concerning the field of aviation archaeology.



We were very pleased and proud with the successful induction of two well-known accomplished aviators into the Colorado Aviation Hall of Fame. Congratulations to Joseph "Joe" Thibodeau and to William "Bill" Hamilton as they join the ranks of exceptional individuals, men and women, eight (8) Organizations, and sixteen (16) who have received Special Recognition Awards. The first inductions by the Colorado Aviation Historical Society were approved in 1969, when the Hall of Fame was inaugurated. The ten (10) Honorees in the first year were: Ivy Baldwin, Allan F. Bonnalie, Ira Boyd Humphrey and his brother Albert E. Humphrey, Will D. "Billy" Parker, Chriss J. Peterson, Reginald Sinclaire, George W. Thompson (believed to be Colorado's first aviator), Frank A. Van Dersarl and Maj. Jerry Cox Vasconcells, all brave, courageous and entrepreneurial. JOE THIBODEAU

Joe Thibodeau has dedicated his life to helping others, adapting his formidable aviation expertise and skills, to educate, engage, entertain and expose youth and adults to aviation and to it's amazing opportunities. His excitement about raising funds for to benefit children is contagious!


His skilled and competive flying have won him outstanding awards in the Reno Air Races. His professional contributions, as an attorney, have significantly benefited a number of non-profit organizations.



BILL HAMILTON

Bill Hamilton, (LTC. USAF Ret.) had a distinguished military career, and was awarded the Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross and the Purple Heart. He is best known for his work with Governor Bill Owen to create what

became known as the 12 AWOS-111 Project, a chain of 12 automated weather observation systems, installed along the Continental Divide, on the twelve mountain passes most often used by small aircraft, thereby greatly increasing safety for pilots.



B/G STEVE RITCHIE

Guest Speaker, B/G Steve Ritchie, a Hall of Fame Honoree, 1997, is the only American pilot in history to score five MiG 21 victories, a record he set while flying eight hundred (800) combat hours in the F-4 Phantom. General Ritchie is the only Air Force pilot ACE of the Vietnam conflict.

He is in demand, as an international speaker, speaking on "patriotism, honor, love of family and country and a commitment to protect the rights of those men and women in the military." He spoke of Matt, his son, in Special Forces for our country and about the challenges that our nation faces. Steve is a spokesman for TAPS, Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors, Inc. for those who have lost a loved one in military service.


